Julie Kaho'oki'eki'e Stewart Williams is a dedicated educator and author who has shared so much of her knowledge with her students and the people of Hawaii.

Born in Kaimukī, O'ahu, on January 2, 1928, "Aunty Julie" as many have come to know her attended Wai'alaie Elementary School and the University of Hawai'i Laboratory School before entering the Kamehameha School for Girls in the seventh grade as a boarder.

In 1946, Williams graduated from Kamehameha Schools and attended the University of Hawai'i Teaching College. After earning her Bachelor of Education degree with a major in Preschool—Primary Education, she went on to also earn a Fifth Year Teaching Certificate. In 1954, Williams moved to Fort Wayne, Indiana with her husband and five children. There she taught kindergarten while earning a Master of Science degree in Reading from St. Francis College.

William joined Kamehameha as a faculty member in 1963 and taught kindergarten through second grade for 17 years. For many summers, she worked in the Explorations Program and served as the KS Intermediate Reading Program director for 16 years until her retirement in 1997.

The KS Intermediate Reading Program serves Hawaiian seventh graders in twelve DOE schools across the state—encouraging them to read about the monarchy which is a required subject for seventh grade social studies.

Williams presently serves as one of three *kupuna* in Kamehameha's Hawaiian Studies Institute's program, Ka 'Ike O Nā Kūpuna, which serves selected kindergarten through third grade children in the public schools.

A gifted writer, Williams has written four books for the "Where I Live" series: Kāne'ohe (2002), Waimanalo (2002), Wai'anae (2003), and Moloka'i (2004). She is currently completing a book on O'ahu's Waialua Moku—a series of five other books on *moku* will follow.

Besides the great contribution to the *keiki* she touches in the Ka 'Ike O Nā Kūpuna Program, Williams is a member of several organizations including the Kamehameha Schools Alumni Association, University of Hawai'i Foundation, Alumni (Ke Anuenue Sorority), Delta Kappa Gamma (Beta Chapter), Bishop Museum Association, Honolulu Academy of Arts, Hawaiian Historical Society, Friends of Mission Houses Museum, Daughters of Hawai'i, and Friends of the Library.
